Community Foundation Elections By Betsy Keithley, Secretary EFCF

The Elfin Forest Community Foundation was established in 1995 with the mission to enhance the quality of rural life in the community of Elfin Forest. The net invested assets on November 4th, 2004 were \$345,321. The Foundation provides funds for project supplies or community events.

It's time again for annual elections for Board membership. The election will occur in February, 2005 at the time of the Town Council and Fire Board elections. The term is three years with a minimum of two face-to-face meetings per year to review grant applications that are due in April and October.

If you would like to run for election, please submit to the EFCF a letter so stating and include signatures from two community residents. Also include a short paragraph about your community experience or interests that will be included in the February issue of the *chaparral*. Community Foundation Grants By Betsy Keithley, Secretary EFCF

The board of directors of the Elfin Forest Community Foundation met on November 4th to evaluate four grant proposals submitted by the October 15th deadline. The applications requested about \$7,000. The funded projects are (in no particular order):

1) Mid Hoppenrath Town Council, funds to send the *chaparral* to all Elfin Forest and Harmony Grove residents twice a year free of charge. \$600.00

2) Eric Anderson Town Council, America in Bloom Committee received money to provide our entry fee, lodging for judges and community signs. \$1000.00

3) Jan Denny Town Council, funding for the preparation and mailing of a community survey. The information will be used by the Town Council in representing the community. \$440.00

4) Jan Denny Town Council, money to provide house addresses on Elfin Forest Road (EFR) for all homes that have EFR addresses but are on unnamed roads that branch off EFR. Boulders with numbers at the intersections of these off-shoot roads will help identify the location of the homes. \$4466.00

Congratulations to all the recipients and the community thanks you for your involvement and commitment to helping maintain the rural environment of Elfin Forest and Harmony Grove.

What's Happening At The Fire Department

A grant submitted to the Volunteer Fire Assistance Program through the California Fire Chiefs Association requests new dash mounted VHF mobile radios to provide us the ability to access all the radio frequencies needed for communications with state and local fire agencies on mutual aid wildland and disaster responses. Previous grants addressed our need for handheld VHF radios.

We have final approval of our request to use the WMD (Weapons of Mass Destruction) FY03 Part II grant money for station alerting. We currently depend on alphanumeric pagers to alert us to a call. This can be an issue when personnel are sleeping at the station at night or when we use noisy equipment. Station alerting will provide a visual and audible alert throughout the station for call response.

December training includes continuing education for the Automatic External Defibrillator/Combitube training with Russ Fraser of Palomar Medical Center and our annual EEOC Unlawful Harassment class. The final business meeting and Christmas party this year includes our Fire Auxiliary and Board of Directors. This should be a fun event and a chance for us all to get together and socialize.

Welcome back PFF/Paramedic Matt Sampson! Matt left in January to go to Paramedic School and now rejoins the Department. We're thrilled at his return and his medical expertise will be of great benefit.

Congratulations to Capt. John Rayes, FF Mike Shea, FF Ryan Parker, PFF Daniel Twohy, PFF Trevor Whitehead, PFF Lance Candelaria, PFF Rodney Ortiz, PFF Matthew Conroy for their 24 hour certification as Swiftwater Rescue Technician 1. This brings our current staffing of Swiftwater trained personnel to 17. We take swiftwater hazards very seriously and strive to maintain an effective number of people trained in river and flood water rescue.

Luckily, the weather has helped us to avoid any catastrophic fires. As we reflect, we see a year of growth, accomplishment and success. A year of a forward thinking Department that knows where we need to go and has a plan to get there. From all of us at the Elfin Forest / Harmony Grove Fire Department, we wish you a safe and happy holiday season.

Bylaw Changes Require Community Vote By Jan Denny

The Board has evaluated its operating procedures and discussed ways to improve its effectiveness in our community. As a result, we have proposed updates to our Bylaws and posted them on the Town Council website: (www.efhgtc.org/bylaws.htm).

These changes must be put to a vote of the residents of Elfin Forest and Harmony Grove at the election in February. All content changes are numbered as footnotes.


The vote will ask whether there are any numbered changes that should not be accepted. Note that the Town Council refers to everyone who owns property in Elfin Forest / Harmony Grove and is eligible to vote on local issues being addressed by the Board.

The following changes are proposed:

- 1. Clarification of requirements for membership in the Town Council and eligibility to vote on Town Council issues, specifically anyone whose name is on a title.
- 2. Statement that the Board will not represent communities outside the CSA107 border.
- 3. Update to reflect how meetings and agendas are communicated (via the website and the Chaparral newsletter), versus the notice board at the fire station.
- 4. Removal of the requirement that Town Council members register with the Secretary of the Board.
- 5. Clarification of the procedure to elect a Board member and appoint a Board officer.
- 6. Clarification on the Board's oversight role regarding committee activities.
- 7. Definition of activities that constitute a conflict of interest.
- 8. Procedure to address community input

Zoning Changes In The Works By Jan Denny

The Town Council is working with New Urban West to solicit the following zoning changes from various county agencies. We believe these changes will help us preserve our rural lifestyle:

- 1. **Department of Public Works**: Re-classify Country Club Drive from 4 lane collector to 2 lane collector within the New Urban West project.
- 2. **Department of Public Works**: Re-classify Harmony Grove Road west of Wilgen Road and Elfin Forest Road from Harmony Grove Road to the City of San Marcos boundary from 4 lane collector to 2 lane collector.
- 3. **Department of Planning and Land Use**: Allow no further quarrying in Harmony Grove.
- 4. **Parks & Recreation**: Dedicate multi-use trails to the county.
- 5. **Parks & Recreation**: Specify that the Equestrian Park is for the local community, the trail head is for horseback riding, and both are to allow only day use, with no overnight parking.
- 6. **Parks & Recreation**: Prohibit formal playing fields for organized sports. Instead provide multiuse community parks with no night lighting that can be used informally for sports or other recreational activities.
- 7. **Department of Public Works**: Reduce exterior lighting to a level consistent with a rural area to maintain dark skies.



America in Bloom Turf and Groundcovers By Evelyn Alemanni

This is the fith in a series of articles on Elfin Forest's 2005 entry in the America in Bloom contest (www.americainbloom.org). In May, 2005, we will be judged on eight criteria: community involvement, tidiness, heritage,



environmental awareness, turf and groundcover, floral displays, landscape, and urban forestry. In 2003, we received high marks in the turf and groundcover category. How can that be, when most of us don't have big lawns? In keeping with the rural character of our community, we need to remember that native chaparral can be considered groundcover. So can wildflower meadows. Using appropriate groundcovers wins points. Did you know that lawns are among the most environmentally unfriendly plantings you can have? They require more maintenance that other plantings, use more fertilizer, pesticides and herbicides, all of which can pollute the groundwater. The pollution created by mowers and leaf blowers diminishes our air quality. When it comes to lawns, less is definitely more.

In this category, judges will be looking for nicely mowed lawns, choices of groundcovers appropriate to the climate, and good maintenance in all areas.



January In The Garden By Evelyn Alemanni

Did you get a nice gift certificate to a local nursery for Christmas? Now's the time to use it. January is the best month to get a head start on your summer garden by shopping for bare root plants. That includes roses, deciduous fruit trees (apples, pears, peaches, plums, etc.), strawberries, and more. Elfin Valley Nursery has received their bare root roses; they have 475 varieties. You can check the availability list at <u>www.sunshinegardensinc.com</u>. When you bring these plants home, put them in a bucket of water for an hour or so, and then plant them right away! Add a little humate and mycorhizzae to the planting hole and you'll see a big difference. (Check <u>www.marilynsown.com</u> for these products.)

Maintenance

No need to water unless several weeks pass without rain.

Deadhead faded flowers.

Continue applying snail and slug bait.

Prune rose bushes and spray with dormant spray.

Spray deciduous fruit trees with dormant spray.

Protect plants from frost.

Pull emerging weeds or spray with Roundup now to avoid lots of work later.

Plant Now

Plant bare root roses, trees, strawberries, raspberries, blackberries, shrubs.

Plant tulip bulbs, gladiolas, iris tubers.

Plant camellias and azaleas.

Plant ornamental trees like flowering plum, acacia, magnolia.

Sow seeds or plant seedlings of winter vegetables. Plant spring color - pansies, Iceland poppies, stock, larkspur.

Water newly planted items.

Buy seeds for summer flowers and vegetables to start indoors now.

Fertilize

Feed cool season lawns. Fertilize citrus, avocado, berries and grapes.


