Minutes of the EF/HG Town Council Mtg

Minutes October 3rd, 2001

General items presented both before and after main speakers. Evelyn Alemanni created a new Elfin Forest web site. Check out at EFHGTC.org

New Board Member: Alan Lasnover.

Secretary volunteer wanted: Patty Newton resigned as secretary due to unexpected events that demand her attention. Kim Hunter temporarily filled in at the meeting. If you are interested in volunteering until elections next March, please contact any Board member.

Trespass Sheriff Forms: Evelyn passed out forms that once returned to the Sheriffs Dept. grant them permission to go onto the signer's property to remove trespassers. If you are not always home, and especially if you are experiencing problems with 4 wheelers, or loitering etc., this will allow the sheriff to remove suspicious persons from your property and act in your absence.

Cell Tower: Nancy Reed explained that the County by law cannot take into account health risks and has no existing ordinances or guidelines on cell towers so they are difficult to fight. Our best defense, is incompatibility with Community Character and possibly the 50 ft. height. By the time you read this the cell tower proposed for Elfin Forest will have been decided by the San Dieguito Planning group.

Ticket prices for the Tim Flannery concert benefiting TECC were dropped to \$30.00.

Streetscape Update: Frank Oddo reported that response to the streetscape plans was uniformly in favor of the design and plans presented at the Sept. meeting, except for one request to add oak trees. In response to that request, along with Martha Blaine's help, 65 oak trees will be added in addition to the 200 pepper trees. Details on how they will be watered until established is still in the works, but several options are being considered. In addition to the previously presented rock work, our extremely talented artist, Jennifer Coburn, is designing and making decorative animal metal cutouts for each street corner. Each street will have a different animal. As Jennifer's work is always fabulous, the main concern was that they be theft and vandalism proof. Frank envisions residents giving directions not only by street names but by saying, turn at the owl, the next street past the rabbit..... The owners of affected property will be required to

sign off permission, on a monument by monument basis before construction, and as Frank plans to also accommodate owner's timing requests we may see a sporadic construction order with gaps to be filled in at later dates. San Elijo is donating and delivering the rock. Work should begin within the next month.

Patsy Fritz, who will be running against Supervisor Horn in the 2002 election introduced herself, her background, her beliefs and answered questions. She knows we were upset by the "hornymander" of our district. She explained some of district law and feels the existing suit based on the Brown Act will not succeed. A better target would have been the vast number of Latino voters Horn escaped by redistricting. Patsy immigrated from Canada to San Diego 22 years ago and has lived in North County the last 20 years, with Valley Center her current home. She has a strong background in disaster preparedness, counter terrorism, and farming. She loves planning and politics. Some of Patsy's goals are fire dept. support and improved emergency centers.

One concept that has been presented is the idea of deed restrictions that would prohibit properties from being split to lots smaller than 2 acres. In theory, deed restrictions supersede zoning, so that if the deed restriction requires a larger lot size than the county (or city) zoning, that is what is used. Does this idea appeal to you? SACRAMENTO - The Governor's Office of Emergency Services today launched California's new toll-free 'Safety Information and Referral Line' - 1-800-550-5234 - which will provide Californians with recorded non-emergency anthrax-related information and referrals from information technicians between 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. daily. Individuals with hearing impairments can obtain information via the toll-free TTY line - 1-800-550-5281.

'The sense of uncertainty many Californians are experiencing as a result of the events of Sept. 11 is understandable' said Dallas Jones, Director of the Governor's Office of Emergency Services (OES). 'But the accurate information about the risks we face and the preparedness steps the public can take that this service provides can allay some of that fear.'

The Safety Information and Referral Line is part of the ongoing efforts by the OES to address the safety concerns of Californians in the aftermath of the Sept. 11 attacks on the World Trade Center and the Pentagon.

The 'one-stop' information line will allow callers to choose from a menu that will give advice on personal and family preparedness, what to do in the event of a possible or real exposure to anthrax, and tips on what to do with suspicious mail or packages. There is also the option of talking to a trained technician who can answer questions and refer callers to various agencies, departments and internet web sites for further information.

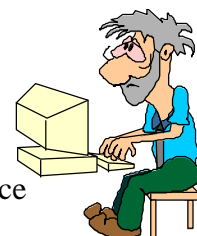

Garden Greeting

With all the horrible events recently I find myself drawn to the garden. On some level time in the garden is better for my soul than almost anything else. I can reconnect with a quiet place deep inside where I can come to some understanding of the unimaginable. I find hope in each plant and seed I touch. With each bucket of compost I find strength to teach my daughter some of the bad things life can bring her way. The cycle of life is played out in my garden, but to me the cycle of birth, blossom and death is a comfort as I know with each season comes it's own special magic, it's own promise and it's own challenges.

I love the fall! The days are cooler making gardening a pleasure. The nights are crisp, inviting rediscovery of sweaters and sweats not seen in many months. It's time to have a fire in the fireplace. Out in the garden if you did all your planting in October you can take a little rest. If you didn't get all the cool season flowers and veggies listed last month planted, you got some work ahead of you! But the wonderful thing about fall is how forgiving it is. Most plants put in now are almost guaranteed survival with the winter rains and cooler temperatures.

Plant all the California natives you want, bulbs of every description, scatter wild flower seeds, put in ground cover, plant old fashioned perennials. Let your imitation run wild, it's the magical time of year in the garden. Do you have an area that has always called to you? Go out and look at it at different times of the day. How much sun or shade does it get? Two of the biggest mistakes gardeners make is planting warm season plants in the cool season and planting in the wrong light conditions. Veggies need at least 6 hours of sun a day as do most flowers unless marked shade tolerant. Once you have an idea how much sun it gets choose the proper plants for the lighting. Then dig in some compost and PLANT!

If you got all the planting done last month, look at your trees. Trees are a valuable asset to any property. Do they need a trim, are they overgrown so the wind can not go through them? If they are dense the foliage will act like a sail and cause them to topple in the coming storms. Many young trees also need staking to keep them upSright. Be sure the material you use to tie to the stake will not cut off the tree's circulation. An old piece of hose over wire is an old staking system that also is recycling at it's

finest. Clean up around your garden and put a thick layer of mulch where you want to discourage weeds.
